



Gas Network Upgrade – Jevington Road Friston

We're preparing to return to complete essential gas network upgrades along Jevington Road in Friston. This work will ensure a continued safe and reliable supply of gas is delivered to nearby homes and businesses. This is part of our 30-year programme of work to replace our old mains, reaching the end of their useful lives, with new, reliable plastic pipe.

Our contractor, DJ Utilities, who are completing this project on our behalf, will be starting work from Monday 19 January. We expect this project to last for approximately eight weeks. We'll be replacing our pipes on the following roads.

Jevington Road – from Monday 19 January – we'll be working from the junction with Old Willingdon Road to the junction with A259 Friston Hill. For everyone's safety Jevington Road will be closed around our work site for approximately two to three weeks. Signed diversions will be in place for affected motorists.

Crowlink Lane – From Monday 2 February for approximately three weeks. we'll be working from the junction with A259 Friston Hill to outside Crowlink Place. Due to the width of the road and the expected size of our excavations there may be times we have to temporarily restrict vehicle access to the Crowlink Car Park. Our team on site will work closely with residents to maintain vehicle access to their properties.

Old Willingdon Road & The Outlook – from Monday 9 February for approximately five weeks. We'll be working from the junction with Jevington Road to outside Waterworks Cottages, and along the full length of The Outlook.

While roads are closed pedestrian access will be maintained throughout. Cyclists will need to dismount and walk past the works area.
