The Club Chair has advised the council that the 9th June cricket event is going ahead. He says: 'The event is timed to coincide with the Cricket World Cup and we are calling it the ED&F Family Games, hosted by East Dean & Friston Cricket Club. Although it will have a cricket theme, it will involve a range of games and activities for the whole family and we want to welcome the whole community, irrespective of whether they are cricket fans. '

The Club would like to seek confirmation of the council's support in running this event. 'It will provide opportunities for local people to have a go at cricket, football, basketball, stoolball, garden sports etc. (plan of details attached) with a lot of activities aimed at people of all ages'. There need be no objection from the council provided that there is event insurance, and the Club is intending to put this in place with their regular insurer.

The Club also asked whether the council would approve the offer of a bar on a suggested contribution basis, but has been advised that they will need an event licence for this.

Thirdly, the Club has asked for help in providing rubbish and recycling bins to be positioned at the cricket club for the day. The parish council has recently obtained a grant to buy litter picking equipment, but there is a long lead-in time on the delivery and it is not yet clear whether the equipment would be available for loan by the time of the event. Basically, however, all rubbish will have to be taken away by the Club after the event.

Finally, the Club is also asking if St. John's Ambulance is able to attend for emergency/first aid backup.

The Club already has a seasonal hire agreement covering their use of the pavilion and other facilities. It would appear that the council does not need to issue any additional licence but only to stipulate that the event must be covered by a licence from the Licensing Authority if alcohol is to be provided, and that event insurance is strongly recommended.
