

Agenda Item 14 Aug Meeting – Replacement Bollards. Downlands Way Car park to Gore Farm Close and re-instatement of footpath to Wayside.

Replacement Bollards

We have received a quotation for replacement of the large bollards which caused an injury not long ago. The new bollards need to be both smooth and easily visible. Reflective bands or plates will be added to tie in with the PIR provided by EDFRA and sited on the garages.

“Installation of 3 bollards - 915mm above the ground level and disposal of the old once. Here are two options:

-concrete bollards with reflecting plates - £800 + VAT

-metal bollards with reflecting strip - £660 + VAT

Note: metal bollards are cheaper and will take reflective strips, whereas the concrete bollards are likely to lose their reflective plates over time as they will not fit flush with the bollard. Since the current gaps between bollards are acceptable, the new bollards will be fitted in the same place.

Proposal: To approve the quotation with favoured style.

Wayside to Downlands Footpath FP36

I have spoken to Jozef regarding this issue and he suggests we use compacted “Type 1 MOT” aggregate rather than tarmac.

Tarmac requires a concrete sub-base, is not permeable and would require additional drainage work to prevent damp penetration to the house.

The aggregate is semi-permeable, hard wearing, cheaper to install and “patchable” should it be required in future.

“Footpath between Wayside and Downlands. Concrete edging where necessary, top up with MOT and made smooth - £1100 + VAT

Both jobs include all materials and waste disposal”

The resident has offered to pay £550 towards the repair (council can re-claim VAT)
